### Pain in the Unexpected

1 Samuel 1:2 Elkannah ... had two wives; one was called Hannah and the other Peninnah. Peninnah had children, but Hannah had none.

1 Samuel 1:5 But to Hannah he gave a double portion because he loved her, and the LORD had closed her womb.

1 Samuel 1:6 And because the LORD had closed her womb, her rival kept provoking her in order to irritate her.

<sup>7</sup> This went on year after year. Whenever Hannah went up to the house of the LORD, her rival provoked her till she wept and would not eat.

1 Samuel 1:8 Elkanah her husband would say to her, "Hannah, why are you weeping? Why don't you eat? Why are you downhearted? Don't I mean more to you than ten sons?"

1 Samuel 1:10 In bitterness of soul Hannah wept much and prayed to the LORD.

1 Samuel 1:13 Hannah was praying in her heart, and her lips were moving but her voice was not heard.

<sup>15</sup> "I am a woman who is deeply troubled. I have not been drinking wine or beer; I was pouring out my soul to the LORD. <sup>16</sup> ...I have been praying here out of my great anguish and grief."

17 Eli answered, "Go in peace, and may the God of Israel

grant you what you have asked of him."

<sup>48</sup> She said, "May your servant find favor in your eyes." Then she went her way and ate something, and her face was no longer downcast.

### Joyfully fulfilling her vow to God

I Samuel 1:19 Early the next morning they arose and worshiped before the LORD and then went back to their home at Ramah. Elkanah lay with Hannah his wife, and the LORD remembered her. <sup>20</sup> So in the course of time Hannah conceived and gave birth to a son. She named him Samuel, saying, "Because I asked the LORD for him."

1 Samuel 1:24 After he was weaned, she took the boy with her ...brought him to the house of the LORD at Shiloh.
<sup>25</sup> When they had slaughtered the bull, they brought the boy to Eli, <sup>26</sup> and she said to him, "As surely as you live, my lord, I am the woman who stood here beside you praying to the LORD.

 $^{27}$  I prayed for this child, and the LORD has granted me what I asked of him.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>28</sup> So now I give him to the LORD. For his whole life he will be given over to the LORD." And he worshiped the LORD there.
