Reason for joy #4: R joy. Trials—> Anticipatory Joy—> Steadfastness—> Maturity—> Realized Joy 2 Corinthians 7:4 I have spoken to you with great frankness; I take great pride in you. I am greatly encouraged; in all our troubles my joy knows no bounds. a. I know that trials will test me. It won't immediately bring "good" feelings.

- b. To count something joy is *initially* a mental discipline, and a command to follow.
 - c. The kind of joy comes when you see (or others see) progress in your Christian maturity, conduct, character or style of relating.
 - d. This kind of joy is powerful because it strikes a blow against our shame, guilt, sense of failure, and repeated failure to be what we long to be—mature like Christ!
